Illumination Domination

There are many lighting treasures to discover (and fall in love with) at the new Ligné Atelier showroom in Wynwood, but we're rather partial to the Serene Orient Express by Windfall and Lalique, and the fusion of aesthetics that are its hallmarks. It all goes back to 1928, when glass visionary René Lalique was commissioned to design the Femme Bras Levés and Joueur de Pipeau patterns for the decorative panels that adorned the interiors of the legendary Orient Express train. Windfall has now taken said patterns and applied them on the crystal prisms that make up the panels of the chandelier. "I love the nod to Lalique's historic past with Windfall's contemporary design direction," says Ligné Roset co-owner Meredith Xavier. "The scale, workmanship and clarity of the prisms is simply breathtaking. When the light comes through the top of the fixture, the motifs within the crystal are delicately illuminated.
